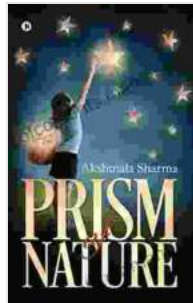

APERTURE

f2.8 f4 f5.6 f8 f11 f16

Keep the aperture medium or narrow to avoid overexposed or out of focus images at very slow shutter speeds.

ISO

100 200 400 800 1600 3200

Keep the ISO as low as possible to enable longer exposure and to avoid noise due to low light.


SHUTTER SPEED

1/4 1/8 1/15 1/30 1/60 1/125 1/250 1/500 1/1000 1/2000

For a longer exposure, use a slower shutter speed (5 - 30 seconds), in order to achieve effects such as trails or soft and cloudy motion blur.

1 STABILIZATION

Get a tripod is a must if you want to explore long exposure photography! It's impossible to take sharp photos at very slow shutter speeds without one.




Besides a tripod, it's a great idea to use a camera stabilizer as well. Because it can reduce any unwanted vibrations and make your photos much sharper.

TIP: Don't you have stabilizer your camera, you can use to take photos more in your hands. Try to avoid shaking camera!

2 NO FILTERS

If you want to experiment with long exposures during daytime, you should consider buying Neutral Density Filters. Landscape photographers use them to achieve that soft, misty effect.




There are neutral ND filters and graduated ND filters, and they can vary greatly in their strength, from 2 stops to 10 stops (the number refers to how much light it blocks.)

TIP: To get the effect "silly water" you can use a 50-stop filter and a shutter speed that is 1000x longer than the exposure.

3 THE ESSENTIALS

3 MANUAL FOCUS

Long exposures are often too challenging for the camera's autofocus, so you might have to rely on manual focus.



Try shooting multiple images and move your focal point off by 1/2 until you get it right.

TIP: If you're shooting a sunset or night, you should use a tripod to make it easier to get your focus correct!

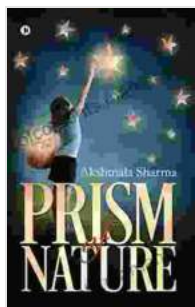

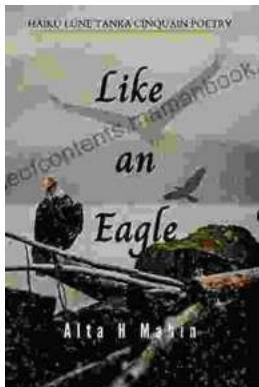

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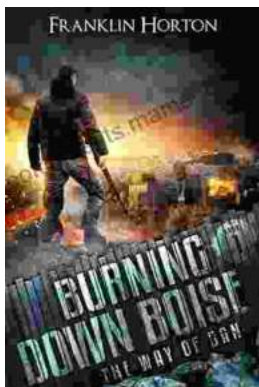
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
